Changes at the 2016 Annual Meeting

THE 2016 ANNUAL MEETING of the Membership of Adams Rural Electric Cooperative, Inc., is scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 27. As I stated in my March *Country Living* article, we are moving the location of the meeting this year. Not only will the location be different, but the format of the day's activities will also be different.

The meeting will be held at the Adams County Fairgrounds, and it will be held during the day. The gate will open at 10:30 a.m. with activities beginning at 11 a.m. The business meeting will be held at 1 p.m.

Food will be served by JT's Stovetop Barbecue Company of West Union. There will be bounce houses for the kids to enjoy. South Central Power Company, a fellow Ohio cooperative based in Lancaster, will provide electrical line safety demonstrations, and there also will be entertainment. The cooperative will have some of its equipment on display, and there will be other displays for viewing.

Tickets will be provided at registration for the meal. Meal tickets will be limited to two adults plus children. Members will go through a line to get their food; it will not be catered to tables. The meal will be provided from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. so everyone will not have to eat at the same time. You may want to watch an electrical safety demonstration or check out some of the other displays before you eat. Activities will conclude by 1 p.m. at the start of the business meeting, with the exception of the bounce houses. Door prizes will be drawn at various times prior to the business meeting, with no drawings after the meeting.

This will be a new direction for the Annual Meeting, and we know that we may experience some bumps in the road. We will do our best to see that the meeting is an enjoyable and informative experience, and if there are issues that arise, we ask that you be patient with us. There is always a learning curve when you do things differently. Any changes or additional information will be provided in the August issue of *Country Living*.

We hope to attract some members who have never attended an annual meeting before. And for those that have attended before, we hope they will enjoy the changes. ☺

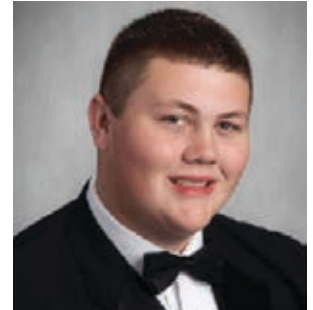
